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

Who We Are

Need Base India (A Foundation for Child Care, and Development) is a non-profit organization started in Dec 2009 with the intention to work towards addressing the basic and fundamental rights of child care, protection, health, and education for children living on streets, runaway children, orphans, children out of school or children under such challenging situations. We are working for the children who are in need of care and protection. They consist of urban homeless, living on the streets, and in other vulnerable situations. Over the last 13 years, we have worked with children, and young people, living in poverty, taking them from a childhood full of challenges to a life with meaningful livelihoods.

What We Do

Need Base India's Childhood to Livelihood program impacts adolescents and youth in the age group of 07 to 24 years. We support and equip them with the care, shelter, education, skills, and knowledge they need to grow up and move out of poverty.

Child Welfare and Development

- Provided comprehensive support to over 463 vulnerable children, ensuring access to education, healthcare, and nutrition.
- Established a new childcare centre in underserved communities, reaching an additional 40 children.

YOUTH EMPOWERMENT

- Empowered 60 youths from NBI through skill development programs, equipping them with essential skills for employment.
- Launched a mentorship initiative, connecting NBI young individuals with experienced professionals for guidance and career development.
- 14 students passed SSLC, 7 Students graduated from PUC, and 10 students pursuing Graduation

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

- Enabled economic independence for 60 rural women through vocational training, tailoring, and creating sustainable livelihoods.
- Conducted workshops on gender equality and women's rights, impacting 200 women and girls.

- Implemented road safety campaigns with local authorities, reaching 10,000 people, and trained college students on safety audits.
- Educated 900 women in Chitradurga on menstrual health. Organized health camps for 2742 students in 7 schools, providing check-ups, vaccinations, and healthcare guidance.

- Expanded the network of community learning centres, establishing 4 new centres in remote areas at Munirabad, Muneshwara Nagar, JJR Nagar, and DJ Halli, by supporting 240 students.
- Provided digital literacy training to 140 community members, improving their access to information & resources.

FOOD KIT DISTRIBUTION FOR VULNERABLE FAMILIES

- Distributed essential supplies, including food and hygiene kits, to 35 families on a monthly basis in Bangalore and North Karnataka.

- Forged partnerships with organizations & government agencies to enhance program sustainability and impact.
- Received recognition & awards for outstanding contributions to child welfare, youth empowerment, and community development.



Nagarathna's journey is a powerful example of how the NBI transformed her life and her family's future. After her father's sudden death, her mother spiraled into alcoholism, leaving Nagarathna's family in dire straits. However, the NBI stepped in to provide support, ensuring Nagarathna's education remained unaffected at our Bridge Camp Girls Home. She excelled in her studies, becoming the first in her family to graduate with 91% in SSLC exams, stood topper in the school, and secured admission into Chaitanya College for a PCMB course. Nagarathna's story continues to inspire, proving that hard work and dedication can overcome any obstacles.



Vani, a 15-year-old girl, faced immense challenges after her mother's passing due to illness. With her father being physically challenged and unable to secure stable employment, there was no one at home to care for the family. Feeling deeply insecure, Vani found solace in Need Base India-Bridge Camp Girls Home, which provided her with essential support, including food, shelter, and education. Despite the hardships, she persevered and achieved a remarkable 68% in her SSLC exams. Currently enrolled in 1st PU, she has chosen commerce as her field of study at Sacred Hearts Girls College, Whitefield, Bangalore. Her goal is to pursue a career in the software industry, showing immense determination and resilience in the face of adversity.



Chaitra, an 11-year-old girl from a small village, faced hardships when her father abandoned the family, leaving her mother struggling to make ends meet as a housekeeper and labourer. The family's financial struggles meant Chaitra couldn't attend school. Recognizing their plight, the Need Base India team enrolled her in Free Basics Girls Home, Srirampura. Initially, her studies were challenging, but with the help of a bridge course, she improved significantly. Now, with support, Chaitra is excelling in her studies at Free Basics Girls Home, overcoming obstacles for a better future.





Bhagyalakshmi, a 10-year-old girl, faced immense challenges as her father, Ningappa, left the family for two years, returning with the added burdens of alcohol addiction and unemployment. Her mother, Shanthamma, worked tirelessly as a labourer but struggled to make ends meet. To provide Bhagyalakshmi with a better future, Shanthamma enrolled her to 6th std in Need Base India, a Shankara Girls Home, Srirampura, Bangalore, providing education and shelter.

Bhagyalakshmi initially faced academic difficulties but, with determination and support, began to thrive, showing remarkable progress in her studies and finding happiness in her new home.



Nandini, a determined 14-year-old from North Karnataka, faces adversity after her father's passing and her mother's struggle with tuberculosis. Despite financial constraints, her passion for education inspired her mother. Recognizing her potential, Nandini was admitted to Need Base India, a Free Basic Girl's Home, Srirampura, Bangalore. Currently, the child is studying in 9th standard at Premier High School. Nandini's unwavering dedication fuels her ambition to become a District Commissioner, a dream she is confident she will realize.

Sameena, the daughter of a migrant laborer, came to Bangalore with her parents a few years ago but wasn't attending school due to their dire circumstances. Identified by the NBI team, it was revealed that her father's alcoholism had made their home unsafe. Consequently,

Sameena found refuge at Rainbow Home, Jalahalli, Bangalore, resuming her education at Rainbow Home starting from the 7th standard. Exceptionally talented academically and in sports, she consistently excelled in monthly tests and even won championships. Sameena's dedication shone brightly during the SSLC board exams, where she scored an impressive 69.28%. Currently, she's pursuing 1st year of commerce at Government PU College, Jalahalli Village, showcasing her resilience and determination for a better future.





Mangala Gowri, a 12-year-old girl, unfortunately, her mother and child were involved in begging. However, Mangala expressed her strong desire to continue her education, displaying remarkable aptitude in both academics and extracurricular activities. Recognizing her potential, she was enrolled to 8th std to pursue her studies at Rainbow Home, Jalahalli, Bangalore. Additionally, her mother has also been admitted to residential care at Rainbow Home, Jalahalli, Bangalore. We consider it a privilege to provide a nurturing environment for Mangala Gowri, allowing her to grow and develop to her fullest potential within our shelter.

In 2018, Shamantha joined Sneh Ghar, Shanthinagar, Bangalore. His family consists of his grandmother, Sundramma, and his elder brother, Huligesh N, who is currently pursuing his 2nd year degree in BCA at Bangalore University. Originally hailing from Sonnenahalli in Kengeri, Karnataka, their family has faced hardships, with Shamantha losing his mother during his first grade and his father even earlier. Shamantha has varied interests, including singing, drawing, reading, and watching TV. He is multilingual, singing in Telugu, Kannada, and Tamil. Currently, he is studying 1st PUC (Commerce History, Economics, Business, and Accounts) at V V Puram College Of Arts And Commerce in Bangalore.



Eight-year-old Ramesh faces a challenging situation as his mother resides in Mahila Dakshatha Samiti Bangalore for her care, protection, and education. Ramesh's father left them six months ago, seeking education and care for his children. Unable to look after her son, and with the family struggling in weak conditions, they lack proper shelter due to various problems. Consequently, Ramesh was admitted to Need Base India Sneh Ghar, Shanthinagar, Bangalore, providing him with the support he needed. Currently attending 3rd grade in the government primary high school in Akkithimmanahalli, Ramesh finds solace and happiness in living at Need Base India - Sneh Ghar.

Currently, there are 463 children residing in the nine residential homes established by the NBI. These children hail from backgrounds marked by severe poverty, orphanhood, single parenthood, financial hardships, and marginalization. NBI staff members identify these vulnerable children through surveys, home visits, and parent meetings. Shockingly, just 10% of children from such circumstances have access to government schools, indicating the dire need for intervention.

The families of these children belong to are predominantly comprised of begging families, homeless, both parents who are alcoholic, both parents eloped, migrant workers and laborers, residing in slums of Bangalore. These families are among the most socially and economically disadvantaged within the urban poor community. Some families had even forced their children into begging, exacerbating the trauma already inflicted by poverty, deprivation, and violence. Upon entering the NBI homes, approximately 48% of the children had never received any formal education. Being placed in an NBI home has shielded these children from the perils of street life, preventing them from falling into the clutches of unhealthy peer groups, drugs, criminal activities, begging, trafficking, child marriages, and domestic violence. Over the past 13 years, NBI homes have positively impacted the lives of 2,000 children facing incredibly challenging circumstances.



INTRODUCTION —

Need Base India is a grassroots organization working to empower street-connected children in Bangalore, Koppal, Raichur, and other parts of Karnataka. Need Base India has relentlessly reached out to the most vulnerable children in numerous street areas since its founding in 2009, including slums, at and around train stops, temples, traffic signals, and so on. Over time, the Need Base India model has changed and evolved. Although the concept of never sending children to school to enroll them in local government schools (typically referred to as street locations with a high concentration of children in need of care).



Our journey began with a singular vision - to protect and improve the lives of children on streets, runaways, orphans, and children from dysfunctional families, who often find themselves in perilous circumstances on the unforgiving streets of our nation. These children, with no place to call home, are subjected to high risks of sexual assault, alcohol and drug dependency, and other addictions as they navigate the harsh realities of street life.

Over the course of the past year, our efforts have borne fruit. We are proud to report that we have successfully provided safe and nurturing homes for 463 children across 09 residential facilities. These children, once vulnerable and marginalized, are now receiving the care, education, and love they deserve. This achievement is a testament to the dedication of our team, the generosity of our supporters, and the unwavering spirit of the children we serve.

Empowered 60 youths in Need Base India through skills programs and linked them with mentors. Enabled 60 rural women's economic independence via vocational training. Conducted workshops on gender equality, reaching 200 women and girls. Ran road safety campaigns with local authorities, like RTO, Traffic Police etc, reaching 10,000 people. Trained college students and reduced road accidents in accident-prone areas. Introduced menstrual health and hygiene initiatives for 2100 women and girls in Chitradurga. Organized health camps for 2742 children in 7 government schools. Established 4 new community learning centers in remote areas and provided digital literacy training to 240 community members.



EDUCATION: —

Need Base India works with 463 children and adolescents who come from backgrounds of street life, runaways, orphans, and dysfunctional families. These children and youngsters often find themselves in precarious situations, facing elevated threats of sexual assault, alcohol/drug dependence, and other street life-related addictions. Throughout the past year, our education program provided a wide range of educational activities for these 463 children, including computer classes, monthly assessments, spoken English classes, bridge courses, remedial classes, value education, life skills development, perspective building, quizzes, and library sessions.

Educational Excellence

92% of our students showed improvement in their academic performance, reflecting the effectiveness of our tailored educational programs. Scholarship Awards: 50 of our exceptional students received scholarship/fees support from donors and CSR teams for their outstanding achievements, enabling them to pursue higher education.

Infrastructure Development

Constructed and equipped 10 new classrooms, creating a better learning environment for our students at 09 residential homes. Expanded our library with 2,000 new books, promoting a reading culture among 463 children.

Skill Development

Provided vocational training to 150 students, empowering them with practical skills for future employment opportunities. Implemented a comprehensive digital literacy program, ensuring all 463 children are proficient in essential computer skills.

Special Initiatives

Launched a specialized support program for 20 children with special needs, providing tailored education and therapies. Implemented an environmental education initiative, planting 120 trees and educating children about the importance of environmental conservation.

Sports and Arts

Our students excelled in inter-school sports competitions, winning 15 medals in various categories. Encouraged artistic expression through workshops, resulting in a remarkable art exhibition showcasing our children's talents. During the annual year NBI organised Annual Sports Day event on 8th Jan 2023 by involving 463 children.

COMPUTER CLASSES

Throughout the yearly program, students from the 5th grade and above enthusiastically engaged in the introductory computer course. Throughout this course, they gained essential skills in Paint and its various uses, and also grasped the fundamentals of Word, Excel, and PowerPoint. The learning journey was incredibly rewarding, and the students were recognized for their active participation and acquired knowledge with certificates from the summer camp.

Digital Literacy

Implemented a comprehensive digital literacy program, ensuring that all 463 children received basic computer skills training. The program covered essential software usage, internet safety, and basic coding concepts.



Coding

Facilitated coding competitions among the students, encouraging healthy competition and fostering a spirit of innovation. Several students showcased exceptional coding skills, solving complex problems and creating innovative projects.


Creative Projects

Collaborative Learning

STEM WORKSHOPS

During the annual year, Need Base India organized STEM workshops across 9 residential homes by involving students from 5th to 10th standard, workshops, exposing children to hands-on activities related to computer programming, coding, science exhibition, experiments, and game development. These workshops sparked curiosity and enthusiasm for technology among the participants.

Nature of Workshops:

The workshops focused on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) activities. Participants were engaged in hands-on activities related to various aspects of technology, including:

- **Computer Programming and Coding:** Participants likely learned the basics of computer programming & coding languages, encouraging computational thinking.
- **Science Exhibition and Experiments:** The workshops included exhibitions and experiments, exposing children to practical applications of scientific concepts, and fostering a deeper understanding of science.
- **Game Development:** Participants were introduced to the process of creating games, which involves elements of programming, design, & logic.



Impact

The workshops had a positive impact on the participants. They sparked curiosity and enthusiasm for technology among the children. This indicates that the hands-on activities and exposure to STEM subjects generated interest and excitement among the participants, potentially inspiring them to explore further studies or careers in these fields.

In summary, Need Base India's initiative involved organizing STEM workshops for children in 5th to 10th standard from 9 residential homes. These workshops covered diverse areas such as computer programming, coding, science experiments, and game development, sparking a keen interest in technology among the participants.

SCIENCE ACTIVITIES AND EXHIBITIONS —


During the course of the annual year, the dedicated team at Need Base India orchestrated a series of impactful Science activities and exhibitions, spanning 9 residential homes and involving a total of 280 enthusiastic students. These exhibitions, held once every quarter, served as vital platforms for these young minds to not only display their talents but also enhance their presentation skills and deepen their understanding of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) subjects.

Guided students in creating creative digital projects, including graphic design, multimedia presentations, and interactive educational games. These projects not only honed their technical skills but also enhanced the carefully designed activities encompassed practical lessons that were both educational and practical. For instance, the children delved into the vital role of water in our daily lives, learning how it is used for washing clothes, cleaning utensils, and personal hygiene activities like bathing. Additionally, the educational journey extended to understanding the intricacies of various body parts, including the eyes, ears, mouth, hands, and legs, fostering a holistic comprehension of human anatomy. Their creativity and presentation abilities.



Furthermore, the children were introduced to the diverse world of food, exploring staples like ragi, wheat, rice, and pulses. Through interactive sessions, they not only learned about the nutritional aspects of these foods but also engaged in hands-on experiences that made learning both enjoyable and memorable. The joy of discovery was further enhanced through solving stimulating science puzzles, igniting their curiosity and problem-solving abilities.

The young participants actively immersed themselves in a wide array of science activities, each designed to broaden their horizons. They explored the origins of food, delving into the journey of sustenance from farm to table. Animal nutrition became a fascinating subject of study, teaching them about the dietary needs of various creatures and the balance required for their well-being. Understanding colors and sizes, a fundamental aspect of early education was made engaging through interactive experiments and demonstrations.



The Box of Science initiative has organized interactive science activities. In the latest session, children delved into the world of magnets, exploring their various types. Additionally, they had a chance to create drawing robots using DC motors, gaining practical insights into their functioning. This engaging session provided valuable knowledge and hands-on experience for the young participants.

Coding Classes:

During the annual year, 18 students participated in the fundamentals of coding. Ms. Sneha, a dedicated volunteer, conducted coding classes for them. During these sessions, they explored the essentials of coding, delved into the world of hacking, and understood the dos and don'ts of coding. The children were captivated by the intriguing facts they discovered about the world of coding.



MATHEMATICS EXHIBITIONS

"Throughout the year, our team organized mathematics exhibitions in 9 residential homes as part of our annual initiative. These exhibitions were designed to enhance children's mathematical skills by encouraging their active participation in various math-related activities and challenges. Our goal was to foster a love for mathematics and boost their confidence in the subject, making learning an enjoyable experience for them."



We hosted a Science and Maths Exhibition, aiming to display the exceptional talent of our children to the visiting Broadridge team from the US, led by Mr. John and Mr. William. During the event, our children elucidated mathematical and scientific concepts depicted through charts and models. Approximately 20 students from various grades actively participated in the exhibition, showcasing their talent admirably.

Outcome:

Participation in mathematics exhibitions enhanced children's problem-solving abilities and fostered a positive attitude towards math, making learning a joyful and engaging experience.

Explore knowledge of science and showcase their talent:

A science exhibition was conducted, where kids created charts, graphs, and modules. Making kids Philomath was the major goal. Children discussed a variety of topics on this day, including the water cycle, the human brain, water dams, water dispensers, and many more. The girls presented the science modules to Mr. Madhu from Azim Premji Foundation, Mr. Rahim, Mr. Mallikarjun, and Mr. Mahadev at this memorable event. Girls were eager to show off their intelligence.



KNOWLEDGE HUB

We organized a knowledge hub to showcase the talents of the children residing in the homes. Every child actively engaged in diverse activities. The event was graced by esteemed guests: Mr. Rahim, Mr. Mallikarjun, Mr. Mahadev, Mr. Praveen, Mr. Manvith, and Ms. Sandhya. The children were excited to display their skills, participating in events such as Cultural and Diversity, History, Science Facts, Knowledge Facts, and Food Facts.



Outcome:

The knowledge hub empowered children by showcasing their diverse talents, boosting their confidence and self-esteem. Through active participation and interaction with esteemed guests, children enhanced their skills, fostering a sense of achievement and enthusiasm for learning.

MONTHLY ASSESSMENT

The monthly education assessments for 463 students have yielded promising outcomes:

Improved Overall Performance:


The regular monthly assessments improved the overall academic performance of the students. Many students showed notable progress in subjects where they previously struggled.

The continuous evaluation helped us in reinforcing their understanding, reducing the likelihood of forgetting important concepts.



PERFORMANCE OF CHILDREN 2022 - 2023



Throughout the 2022-2023 academic year, we are delighted to report that we provided support to 463 students through various initiatives, including education, evening classes, remedial sessions, and monthly assessments. Among these students, 56 excelled with a score of 80% and above, 268 achieved grades between 60% and 80%, 96 students scored between 40% and 60%, and 43 students performed below 40%.



Spoken English classes

In the academic year 2022-2023, Need Base India conducted Spoken English classes for a total of 463 students. The organization remained committed to providing high-quality education, focusing on enhancing communication skills and empowering students through spoken English proficiency.

Curriculum and Teaching Methodology

The curriculum was designed to be comprehensive, covering fundamental grammar rules, vocabulary enhancement, conversational skills, and public speaking techniques. Interactive learning methods, including group discussions, role plays, and multimedia presentations, were incorporated to make the classes engaging and effective.



Student Progress and Achievements:

Throughout the year, students showed remarkable progress in their spoken English skills. Regular assessments and evaluations were conducted to track individual development. Several students demonstrated significant improvements in their confidence levels, fluency, and vocabulary. Additionally, a number of students participated and excelled in inter-school and inter-district English-speaking competitions, showcasing the effectiveness of the training provided.

BRIDGE COURSE —

The Bridge Course program at Need Base India welcomed a diverse group of students, including those from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, migrated communities, and marginalized sections of society. Students participating in the Bridge Course exhibited remarkable progress in their academics. Many students demonstrated substantial improvements in their grades, showcasing the effectiveness of the program in addressing learning gaps.

Transition to Mainstream Education

One of the primary objectives of the Bridge Course was to prepare students for seamless integration into mainstream educational institutions. As a result of the program's holistic approach, a significant number of students successfully transitioned to higher grades in formal schools, equipped with improved academic skills and enhanced self-confidence.

REMEDIAL CLASSES —

The remedial classes conducted during the academic year 2022-2023 aimed to provide additional support and personalized instruction to 463 students by providing extra assistance in their studies. These classes were designed to address specific learning needs, enhance academic skills, and promote a positive learning experience for all participants.



OUTCOMES

01

Academic Progress:

Significant improvement was observed in the understanding of core subjects among 85% of the students. Many showed notable progress in their classwork and assessments.

02

Increased Participation:

Enhanced engagement and active participation were noted in regular classroom activities, indicating improved confidence levels.

Individualized Support:

463 children were provided individual support, which helped them to progress in their academics.



NUTRITION, HEALTHCARE & HYGIENE SUPPORT

Ensuring the well-being of children includes providing them with good nutrition. Children are served four healthy meals each day, with eggs and non-vegetarian options available weekly. Fruits are offered twice a week, fruit salads twice a month, eggs/meat once a week, and sprouts once a week, with the menu changing weekly to prevent monotony. Children identified as underweight during check-ups receive additional nutrition. RO purifiers have been installed in homes to provide clean drinking water.



To promote health and hygiene, trained medical professionals conducted awareness sessions twice a year. Quarterly health camps were organized for eye, ENT, and dental check-ups at in-house and private hospitals. All 463 children receive deworming medicine twice a year. During the annual year, Regular growth monitoring and BMI tests are conducted quarterly.

To promote the mental well-being of the 463 children, monthly group counselling and value education sessions were conducted, incorporating storytelling techniques. These sessions are tailored for children facing issues such as attention-seeking, anger, inappropriate language use, school absenteeism, academic struggles, depression, aggression, lack of focus, and social withdrawal. Various activities like group work, icebreakers, problem-solving exercises, group discussions, and brainstorming are employed during these sessions.

Children needing individual support received personalized counselling sessions, employing methods of modification and motivation. Positive reinforcement is used to encourage self-regulatory activities, such as refraining from unwanted conversations, adhering to routines, practicing meditation, reading, and self-reflection. Each of the 463 children received individual attention, care, and affection. The nurturing and stimulating atmosphere of the home also played a significant role in helping emotionally distressed children attain emotional stability.



"A dental check-up was conducted on January 22, 2023, by Dr. Priya for 58 children at **Bridge Camp Girls Home**. The check-up helped us monitor the children's dental status, and 2 children were provided with spectacles."



General Health

On March 30, 2023, Mrs. Shruthi, a dedicated healthcare professional, conducted a comprehensive general health examination at **Champion Boys Home**. With meticulous care and attention, she assessed the well-being of 35 children residing there. We are delighted to report that the doctor's observations were exceedingly positive each child was found to be in excellent health and exhibited remarkable levels of energy and activity.



Dental & General Health

On April 9th, the dedicated team from Being Social organized a dental check-up, emphasizing the significance of oral health. Subsequently, on April 11th, experienced doctors from Sankara Eye Hospital conducted comprehensive eye check-ups at **Champion Girls Home**. Furthermore, a comprehensive General Health Check-up took place on September 26, 2022. During this examination, the healthcare professionals identified minor health issues among some of the girls. These concerns were promptly addressed, and appropriate medications were prescribed, ensuring that the girls received the necessary care and attention for their well-being.



General Body Check Up

Throughout the years 2022 to 2023, **Free Basics Girls Home** prioritized the health and well-being of its 76 children through a series of meticulous health check-ups conducted by a team of dedicated medical professionals. On June 17, 2022, Dr. Supriya, an experienced ENT specialist, conducted an ear, nose, and throat check-up, on July 1, 2022, Dr. Sushma organized an eye camp. On July 31, 2022, a general health check-up was overseen by Dr. T. P. Nagendra. Additionally, on the same day, a dermatology check-up was led by Dr. Lakshmi, addressing skin health and related concerns among the children.



Later in the year, on November 8, 2022, Dr. Ravi organized another eye camp, emphasizing the significance of regular eye care and addressing any new concerns that may have arisen since the previous camp. Finally, on February 12, 2023, Dr. Shruthi conducted a general health check-up, providing a comprehensive overview of the children's health and development.

These regular health check-ups have played a pivotal role in monitoring the health and development of the 76 children at **Free Basics Girls Home**. By ensuring timely medical interventions and promoting overall well-being, these initiatives reflect the home's unwavering commitment to the children's health, providing them with the best opportunities to thrive and lead healthy lives.



General Health Camps

Throughout the year, the **Rainbow Home** team organized three general health camps with support from the Rotary Club and Lions Club Sanjayanagara. A few children were diagnosed with illnesses and received medical and dietary assistance based on doctor's recommendations. Dr. Rajeshwari from the government PHC conducted health evaluations, including hemoglobin tests. Only four out of 70 girls had low hemoglobin levels. Additionally, an annual health camp for parents, including eye, BP, and sugar check-ups, was held in collaboration with the Rainbow State Office team.



Dental Care

65 children at **Sneh Ghar** had health check-ups, focusing on dental care and hydration. Two kids with eye infections were referred to specialists. Hygiene practices were improved, and older children received DPT immunizations on June 24, 2022. Dr. Doylin conducted general examinations for 57 children and provided prompt medical attention, ensuring their well-being.

Health Camp

A health camp on February 5, 2023, included check-ups for parents and children. Another camp on July 31st involved general and dermatology check-ups for 25 children by Dr. T P Nagendra and Dr. Lakshmi. Dr. Ravi diagnosed eye issues on November 8, 2022, providing glasses to three children.



CELEBRATIONS

In the spirit of giving, compassion, and community, this program has been a beacon of hope and joy for 463 children who rely on our support. As we embark on this journey, celebrate the incredible achievements, dreams, and resilience of these young souls. Through a myriad of events, initiatives, and activities, the Celebrations program not only brings happiness to their lives but also acts as a platform for growth, learning, and empowerment. Observing special commemorative days, festivals, and birthdays serves as an opportunity to foster a sense of community and strengthen bonds among the residents of NBI homes. These occasions are embraced as teaching moments to educate the 463 children about the historical and cultural significance of each event, both in the context of childhood and their roles as citizens of India.

CELEBRATIONS —



NBI homes actively celebrated important dates such as National Youth Day (January 12th), Republic Day (January 26th), Ambedkar Jayanti (April 14th), Basava Jayanti (honouring the reformer-poet Basaveshwara - May 7th), Independence Day (August 15th), Teacher's Day (September 5th), Gandhi Jayanti and Shastri Jayanti (October 2nd),

Children's Day (November 14th), International Disability Day (December 3rd), and Kanakadasa Jayanti (commemorating the Kuruba poet-saint on December 3rd). Additionally, the homes mark Tree Planting Day (June 5th) in honour of Salumarada Thimmakka, the environmentalist icon, and International Yoga Day (June 22nd) to highlight the importance of yoga in maintaining good health.



Festivals were significant moments for celebration in the homes, marked by special occasions where new clothes, cakes, sweets, and a unique lunch were shared. Festivals such as Sankranti, Raksha Bandhan, Ugadi, Gowri-Ganesha, Ramzan, Holi, Dasara, Diwali, Eid Milad, Christmas, and New Year were observed with enthusiasm. Teams within the homes explained the importance and cultural relevance of these festivals and special commemorative days, highlighting their status as national festivals in India. Working alongside the children, the teams adorned the homes lavishly, with everyone donning colourful attire. On these festive days, a special lunch featuring delectable sweets was served to commemorate the occasion.

LEARNING, CREATIVITY & DEVELOPMENT —

In the heart of India, where the spirit of education and empowerment intertwines, there exists a beacon of hope and progress known as the "Learning, Creativity & Development Program." Need Base India, a transformative initiative has been a cornerstone in the lives of 463 children throughout the annual year 2022-2023.



Amid the diverse and vibrant landscape of our nation, these young minds embark on a journey that transcends conventional education. The program, designed with utmost care and dedication, not only imparts knowledge but ignites the flames of creativity and cultivates holistic development. With the goal of nurturing each child's unique potential, the Learning, Creativity & Development Program stands as a testament to the unwavering commitment to a brighter, more inclusive future.



Over the course of this program, children are guided through a dynamic and immersive educational experience. Through innovative teaching methods, interactive learning modules, and a supportive environment, children were encouraged to explore their inner talents, hone their skills, and foster a spirit of creativity that knows no bounds.

Summer Camp

Need Base India firmly believes in the balance between work and play in a child's life. While formal education is crucial for their future, engaging in creative pursuits is equally vital for their happiness and personal growth. Every year, during April and May, each NBI home organized a 30-day's summer camp. These camps are designed to instil positive values, promote a healthy lifestyle, and emphasize the importance of education. The camps play a significant role in boosting the children's self-esteem and confidence. NBI goes to great lengths to ensure that the 463 children have the opportunity to explore their creative and imaginative abilities. The organization arranged various activities such as drawing, singing, dancing, reading, debating, quizzes, and sports competitions. Additionally, art and craft classes are conducted on weekends.

Each NBI home conducts monthly sessions on value education and life skills. These classes revolve around essential themes such as honesty, responsibility, truthfulness, mutual respect, integrity, assertiveness, kindness, compassion, time management, leadership, discipline, teamwork, and tolerance.



NURTURING TOMORROW'S LEADERS: NEED BASE INDIA'S LIFE SKILLS & VALUE EDUCATION PROGRAM



In the dynamic landscape of education, where academic excellence often takes the forefront, it is imperative not to overlook the holistic development of our future generations. Recognizing this crucial need, Need Base India proudly initiated its Life Skills & Value Education Program for the annual year 2022-2023, reaching out to a diverse group of 463 children from varied backgrounds and communities.

As the world continues to evolve, so do the demands placed upon young individuals. Beyond the realms of textbooks and classrooms, life skills and values form the bedrock upon which the character and capabilities of our youth are built. Need Base India's program is a testament to its unwavering commitment to empowering children with not just knowledge but also the essential tools required to navigate the complex journey of life successfully.



Over the course of this program, these 463 children are set to embark on a transformative journey that extends far beyond conventional education. They will delve into the intricacies of self-awareness, effective communication, problem-solving, decision-making, and numerous other life skills, while simultaneously imbibing timeless values such as empathy, integrity, responsibility, and compassion.



Ms. Navya leads the sympathy session, while Ms. Sneha covers Coding Basics. At Cadenza Academy, Ms. Manisha teaches Kathak dance to children, and Ms. Myra, a Taekwondo trainer, conducts self-defense sessions. Ms. Vaibhavi presents "River of Life," and Ms. Palani focuses on social skills and table manners. Ms. Megha Ravuri leads the singing session, and the Projectdefy Education organization conducts drawing sessions at the Need Base India Inter home level, with six girls participating from our home. Ms. Navya also conducts the "God is Omnipresent" session. Enfolded sessions are organized for all students, and Excellent Chess Academy offers chess sessions. Ms. Renu oversees the Arts & and Crafts sessions.

July: Fostering teamwork and joyful learning. August 15: Exploring life's journey. September: Learning to value and prioritize daily essentials. October 15: Addressing relationships, trust, and reproduction issues. November 26: Embracing responsibility and proactive behavior. December 26: Nurturing relationships and home. January 26: Reflecting on turning 30. February 15: Exploring self-identity and friendship. March 2: Self-discovery through elemental perspectives.

Throughout the year, we've journeyed together, emphasizing essential values and learning important life lessons. From promoting teamwork on April 7th to aspiring for the changes we desire on June 24th and envisioning a better tomorrow on June 30th, we've embraced empathy, values, and education. Honesty became a cornerstone on July 30th, symbolized by the metaphorical "river of life." Achieving a sense of lightness in living on September 24th, we accepted responsibility on October 12th and honed our problem-solving skills by December 14th. Nurturing relationships and our homes gained significance on December 27th. Additionally, we explored topics vital to personal growth, from understanding menstruation cycles and hormonal changes on June 7th to embracing individuality, body ownership, gender, and sexual identity on various dates in June. Each moment added depth to our understanding, shaping us into more knowledgeable and compassionate individuals.

On July 30th, 2022, we focused on honing life skills at 'Destination Tomorrow.' The following day, we continued this journey, emphasizing its importance. Earlier, on April 9th, 2022, we delved into social values, particularly justice, instilling essential ethical principles. Transitioning into August, we explored the metaphorical 'River of Life' on August 31st, symbolizing life's unpredictable journey. Later, on September 19th, 2022, we gained insights from a session about the great personality, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, enriching our understanding of history and leadership.



Students in grades 6th to 8th explored the vital role of education. Engaging activities like 'River of Life,' 'Moolya Mall,' and 'Art and Craft' were facilitated by Ms. Prema and Ms. Pooja, including a session on the "Art of Appreciation." Addressing challenges, some 6th and 7th-grade girls found themselves disinterested in studies, leading to a diversion from their academic focus. Another session, 'When I Am 30 Years Old,' prompted reflection on personal growth and maturity, while emphasizing a proactive and responsible approach to life.

During the Summer camp, Mr. Chandrappa emphasized the importance of discipline, integrating it with life skills sessions. In the "Mapping for Tomorrow" activity, children were provided with basic items like a banana, toothpick, knife, needle, and thread to explore creativity and problem-solving. Mr. Shankar G. Mearki led a session on "Theories of Goodness," imparting valuable lessons. Additionally, our boys received uniforms for boxing from the Rock Bull Academy on November 2nd. A session titled "Seeing, naming, claiming" was conducted on September 24th, encouraging self-awareness and empowerment. In the "Moolya Mall" values shop activity, children wore a designated cap and shared their aspirations, fostering a sense of identity and purpose.





SPORTS ———

On January 8th, 2023, Need Base India hosted its Annual Sports Day in Police Campus, Adugodu, Komangala, where 463 children came together to display their athletic talents. The program was inaugurated by Shri Ramalinga Reddy (MLS), MV Mohan, ex councillor and DYPC. All 463 participants enthusiastically engaged in various sports activities, including Kabbadi, Coko, Frog race, volleyball, throw ball, and more. We are thrilled to announce that the children from Rainbow Home emerged victorious, securing the 1st prize.



CHILDREN'S DAY CELEBRATION ———

On November 19th, a vibrant Children's Day celebration took place at Gandhi Bhavan, jointly organized by Need Base India and Pragathi Charitable Trust. A total of 120 children from Need Base India actively participated in the event, showcasing their talents through various cultural activities and programs. The children demonstrated remarkable skills, earning several prizes in the cultural events. Additionally, the event included a special segment where the exceptional academic achievements of SSLC and PUC students were recognized and honored.



VIA- GLOBAL ROAD SAFETY PROGRAM ———

Via- Global Road Safety Program held a Symposium for key stakeholders, in collaboration with United Way Mumbai. Thanks to their support, we successfully imparted road safety education to 10 schools, 100 teachers, and 1000 students in Bangalore. On March 16th, we brought together VIA's major supporters to discuss Global Road Safety Education. Gratitude to United Way Mumbai and Total Energies for their efforts in promoting public safety through the Road Safety Education Training Program for students in Bangalore.



BOARD MEETING ———

A meeting of the Need Base India, Annual General & Governing Board Meeting was held on 5th Nov 2022. During the annual year 2022 to 2023 team organised 3 Board Meetings.

CHILDREN ACHIEVEMENTS






COMMUNITY CARE PROGRAM

We wanted to extend our service to the children living in the community facing difficulties in learning, schooling, or any such issues. We address a variety of topics, including single parents, dysfunctional families, illiterate parents, and families from very low socioeconomic backgrounds. We are covering 200 children in Bangalore and Koppal District. We are already running Community Learning Centers in DJ Halli, Yeshwanthpur, and JJR Nagar in Bangalore. One Centre in Munirabad, Koppal District.

In these 4 centers, more than 200 children are coming to learn after school hours. We are teaching basic foundations, life skills, moral values, perspective building, sports, and promoting cultural and peacebuilding. There is a need to provide coaching in English, Maths, Science, and Kannada in these three centers.



Key Activities at the center's:

- Tutoring and academic support: Started evening classes for the children, helping them with homework support, started basic foundation classes, storytelling sessions, etc.
- Conducted Art and craft classes, celebrated Gandhi Jayanthi, Deepawali Children's Day, and Christmas festival. These activities increased the enrolment strength and created interest in education.
- At Muneshwara Centre conducted health check-ups for the children like General Health check-ups, dental care, and mental health counseling to children.
- Parent and family engagement: Centers offered workshops and other programs to help parents and families support their children's education and well-being. Need to mention it very specifically.
- Distributed 10 cycles, and exam pads to students at Munirabad. PI mention the date of Distribution.
- Organized Parent meetings at Muneshwara nagar, D.J.Halli, and JJR nagar. Mention the date and number of parents who attended.
- New rooftop & Flowering work at Munirabad center.

Science and math experiments were conducted on the 22nd & 28th of December at Munirabad & Muneshwara Nagar, it was an excellent way for 120 children at community learning centers to learn about these subjects in a hands-on and interactive way. Teachers and volunteers used a wide range of concepts and skills, such as observation, hypothesis testing, problem-solving, and critical thinking. Teacher Chelvaraj conducted the experiments of science and mathematician Srinivas Ramanujan. Overall, science and math experiments are an effective way which helped children at community learning centers about these subjects and helped them to develop important skills.



ROAD SAFETY PROGRAMS: —

During the annual period from 2022 to 2023, a series of significant initiatives were undertaken by Need Base India. These initiatives aimed to address various critical issues in the community, ranging from road safety awareness to menstrual health and hygiene, as well as child healthcare.

* Road Safety Awareness Campaigns

Objective: The primary goal of this initiative was to enhance road safety awareness among the local population.

Collaboration with Local Authorities: The organization collaborated with local authorities, which is essential for gaining access to resources, infrastructure, and support for the campaigns.

Reach: The campaign was successful in reaching out to a substantial audience, with approximately 10,000 individuals actively participating and benefiting from it.



* Training for College Students and Safety Audits

Objective: This component of the initiative aimed to reduce road accidents by providing training to college students and conducting safety audits in accident-prone areas.

Student Training: College students were given orientation, likely on safe driving practices and awareness of road safety regulations. This training has included practical and theoretical components.

Safety Audits: The organization, along with experts, evaluated accident-prone areas to identify potential hazards and recommend safety improvements.

Impact: The combined efforts of training and safety audits contributed to a significant reduction in road accidents, making the roads safer for both drivers and pedestrians.



* Menstrual Health and Hygiene Initiative in Chitradurga

Objective: This initiative was centered in the Chitradurga region and aimed to promote menstrual health and hygiene among women and girls.

Education and Empowerment: The initiative educated and empowered approximately 2100 women and girls, by providing information on menstrual hygiene practices, distributing menstrual hygiene products, and fostering a supportive environment for discussion.



* Health Camps for Children in Government Schools

Objective: This initiative was focused on the well-being of school children and involved organizing health camps within seven government schools.

Services Offered: During these camps, essential medical check-ups were conducted, vaccinations were administered, and healthcare guidance was provided to approximately 2742 children at GHS Bagalagunte, GHPS Manjunatha Nagara, GMPS Nagasandra, GHPS Chikkasandra, SBRHS Thotagere, GHPS Hesaraghatta and GHPS Bagalagunte

Impact: This initiative not only helped identify and address health issues among school children but also contributed to disease prevention through vaccinations and health education.



In summary, these initiatives conducted during the annual period from 2022 to 2023 reflect a comprehensive and community-focused approach to addressing critical issues. They demonstrate the importance of collaboration with local authorities, education, and healthcare services in improving the well-being and safety of the community, especially in the areas of road safety, menstrual health and hygiene, and child healthcare. This annual program is designed to equip our teachers with the tools they need to inspire, engage, and nurture the potential of each student.



Throughout the course of the year, our dedicated team coordinated a series of comprehensive staff capacity-building initiatives. These programs encompassed a wide array of topics, each designed to empower our staff and enhance their skills. The various training sessions included:

- **Induction Training:** This program ensured that newcomers to our team were well-equipped with the knowledge and tools necessary to excel in their roles (12th May 2022)
- **Teacher Training Workshop on Best Classroom Practices:** For our educators, this workshop aimed to enrich teaching techniques and foster a dynamic learning environment. (21st Aug 2022)



- **Life Skill Training:** Equipped 26 staff with essential life skills to navigate both personal and professional challenges effectively.
- **Professional Development for Team Leaders:** Providing our leaders with the resources and insights they need to effectively guide their teams.
- **First Aid Training:** Equipped 18 team with the vital skills to respond to medical emergencies promptly and efficiently.
- **Care for Caregivers:** Recognizing the importance of self-care, this session provided strategies for maintaining mental and emotional well-being.
- **Time Management and Decision Making:** These vital skills were honed in order to optimize productivity and enhance the decision-making process.

YOUNG FRIENDS & INDUSTRY EXPOSURE —

In a rapidly evolving world, where the nexus between education and practical experience has become increasingly vital, the Young Friends & Industry Exposure Program stands as a beacon of opportunity and growth. Need Base India is proud to present the YFIEP for the annual year 2022-2023, a transformative initiative aimed at empowering the youth with invaluable industry exposure.



On May 26, 2022, a group of children embarked on a trek to Antaragange in Kolar and explored the Dakshina Karnataka Kala Kshetra. Later, on August 14, 2022, they had the opportunity to visit ISRO. In March, the children visited IISc Bangalore, enhancing their knowledge. Another memorable trip took place on January 14, 2023, to Jnapada Loka Ramnagara, a captivating folk museum.

As part of the Pehchan program, the children were taken on a trip to Mumbai in December. They also had exposure visits to prominent places such as the Hilton five-star hotel and Azim Premji University in Bangalore. Additionally, they visited Sathiya Foundation Bangalore, showcasing a broad spectrum of experiences.



These young friends actively participated in events like the film festival in Kolar and visited the prestigious Indian Institute of Management in Bangalore. They enthusiastically attended the Udhan camp and engaged in training sessions focusing on professional and personal management. Furthermore, these young enthusiasts actively participated in various programs and events organized at Sneh Ghar, demonstrating their eagerness to learn and explore.

TAILORING CENTER —

Need Base India has always believed in the power of community engagement and volunteerism to drive positive change. The year 2022-2023 was no exception, as our volunteers continued to play a pivotal role in our mission to uplift and empower those in need. Through this program, we aimed to harness the skills, energy, and enthusiasm of volunteers from diverse backgrounds to make a meaningful difference in the lives of marginalized communities, children, and underserved populations across Karnataka.



On 9th March 2023, Need Base India started a new program on Skill Development Tailoring Center at Koppal, North Karnataka with the support of Broadridge. The Tailoring centers provide training in various aspects of sewing, including pattern making, fabric selection, and alterations. We are often established to promote entrepreneurship and skill development, especially among women and underprivileged communities. The tailoring center is a significant program that helps to create employment opportunities and promote self-sufficiency, and empowerment.



In an effort to empower and uplift rural women, special emphasis has been placed on providing Employment and Entrepreneurship Support through tailoring classes in rural Koppal. Through this initiative, 60 rural women are given the means to become self-reliant, improve their economic prospects, and contribute to the overall development of their communities. The program has successfully helped rural women to earn additional income, during the annual year 60+ new members have applied for the upcoming batch.

Outreach Program 2022-2023

In the past year, our outreach team embarked on a mission to reach out to the most marginalized members of our society. We traversed through various communities, including slums, railway stations, bus stops, and signals, tirelessly searching for children left behind due to unfortunate circumstances. This concerted effort was not in vain, as we managed to identify and provide support to 180 needy children facing dire situations, including orphans, runaways, and those living with single parents.

In our pursuit of providing a safe haven for these children, we enrolled 90 of them in our residential care program. This initiative aimed to offer them a stable environment, access to education, healthcare, and most importantly, the warmth of a loving home. Under the vigilant care of our trained staff, these children began their journey toward healing, growth, and empowerment.

ONLINE CLASSES IN GOVT SCHOOL, ——— NORTH KARNATAKA

During the period spanning from 2022 to 2023, the Need Base India & eVidyaloka program achieved a significant milestone by implementing its educational initiatives in 30 new schools. These efforts targeted students ranging from the 5th to the 10th standard, thereby encompassing a crucial phase in their academic journey. The program's expansion played a pivotal role in shaping the educational landscape for these young minds.

Through the concerted efforts of the Need Base India and the eVidyaloka program, a total of 8,000 student were reached and positively impacted. By extending its reach to these additional schools, the program not only broadened its scope but also deepened its impact on the lives of these students. Access to quality education became a reality for these young learners, empowering them with knowledge and skills that would undoubtedly shape their future.



In a significant step towards enhancing the quality of education, three new Facilitators (FCs) and twenty Community Ambassadors (CAs) embarked on a comprehensive training journey with eVidyaloka. This training, conducted online, aimed at equipping these dedicated individuals with the necessary skills and knowledge to effectively facilitate eVidyaloka's online classes.



The training program focused on various aspects of online teaching, encompassing interactive teaching techniques, effective use of digital resources, classroom management strategies, and methods to engage students in a virtual learning environment. The goal was to empower the FCs and CAs with the expertise needed to create a dynamic and engaging online learning experience for the students they would be guiding.



Throughout the past year, we effectively assisted 2,000 students through our online education programs at Yadgir 9 schools, Raichur 11 schools, and 12 old schools at Koppal and Sindhanuru focusing on subjects such as English, mathematics, and science. These classes not only enhanced students' skills but also provided them with advanced technological support for their online learning experience, alongside initiatives to develop school infrastructure.

PROMOTE CULTURE OF PEACE IN THE COMMUNITIES

During the annual year, with the assistance of Terre des hommes, we launched a program aimed at cultivating a culture of peace within communities. This initiative was rolled out in four specific wards of Bangalore: D.J.Halli, K.G.Halli, JJR Nagar, and Chaluvadipalya. These areas were chosen due to previous communal tensions between local religious groups.



After School Programme:

In four areas (D.J.Halli, K.G.Halli, JJR Nagar, and Chaluvadipalya), we established post-school centers, assisting 200 children from diverse backgrounds, including 53 Muslims, 79 Hindus, and 38 Christians. These centers ensured regular school attendance and provided evening classes. The children actively participated in religious festivals, fostering cultural understanding and mutual respect, and promoting community unity.



Enrolment campaign:

In D.J. Halli, K.G. Halli, JJR Nagar, and Chaluvadipalya, a school enrollment campaign was conducted. Involving 200 students, 26 parents, and 6 government schoolteachers, the campaign highlighted education's importance. 15 children aged 7 to 10 years were identified and enrolled in government schools, showcasing the campaign's success.



Formation of Children's Clubs:

We formed a children's club with 25 young members, fostering democracy by electing leaders. This initiative empowered these students, enabling active community involvement. During the annual year we organized 4 meetings with youth club members. The club, comprising 200 children, facilitates meaningful discussions on diverse topics, guided by their teacher.



Peace Building Training for Youth:

At ISI Benson Town, 30 youth volunteers and 5 staff members from partner NGOs underwent peace-building training from July 14th to 16th, 2023. Affiliated with TDH and NBI, this session aimed to equip volunteers with essential skills for fostering peace.

DISABILITY PROGRAM

"Since 2020, Need Base India has been in partnership with Samartha Trust, aiming to provide vital support to disabled children. We are delighted to announce that throughout the annual period from 2022 to 2023, Need Base India and Samartha Trust have collaborated tirelessly to assist disabled children in the areas of Basic Education, Physiotherapy, and Rehabilitation.

Presently, our joint efforts have enabled us to extend our support to **30 children, comprising 18 boys and 12 girls**, at our center located in Chalavadi Palya, Bangalore. We are committed to continuing our mission of making a positive difference in the lives of these children and their families."



"Throughout the annual period from 2022 to 2023, our dedicated team ensured that the 30 children received essential daily Rehabilitation support. Additionally, we were able to provide significant assistance, including the provision of three wheelchairs, two splints, and two special chairs to enhance the mobility and comfort of the children. Furthermore, as part of our ongoing commitment to their well-being, we supplied necessary medicines on a monthly basis to aid the health of eight children. These efforts are a testament to our dedication to improving the lives of these young individuals."



COLLABORATION WITH THE SUNDAR BHARAT FOUNDATION

Since 2021, Need Base India (NBI) has forged a meaningful partnership with the Sundar Bharath Foundation, a dedicated organization working tirelessly to uplift rural children, youths, and communities in the remote areas of North Karnataka. Through this collaboration, NBI has played a pivotal role in supporting the Foundation's various initiatives, making a significant impact on the lives of the rural population.



Throughout the annual year, NBI wholeheartedly supported the Sundar Bharath Foundation in multiple ways. Firstly, NBI actively participated in the implementation of crucial programs aimed at enhancing the overall well-being and education of the rural youth. These programs encompassed a wide range of activities, including educational workshops, skill development sessions, and health awareness campaigns, all tailored to meet the unique needs of the rural communities.

Moreover, NBI contributed substantially to the Infrastructure Development projects undertaken by the Sundar Bharath Foundation. By investing in the creation and renovation of essential infrastructures such as schools, community centers, and libraries, NBI has facilitated an environment conducive to learning and growth for the children and youths in these rural areas.



Recognizing the importance of digital literacy in the modern age, NBI sponsored computer classes for the rural youth. These classes equipped them with essential computer skills, empowering them to navigate the digital landscape with confidence and opening doors to a world of opportunities previously beyond their reach.

NBI's commitment to education extended beyond the classroom, as the organization organized evening classes for rural children. These classes not only bolstered their academic knowledge but also fostered a love for learning, igniting curiosity and creativity. Furthermore, NBI arranged outings and excursions for the rural children, offering them moments of joy, exploration, and a chance to broaden their horizons. These outings not only provided a break from their daily routine but also exposed them to new experiences, fostering personal growth and self-confidence.



In total, NBI's unwavering support positively impacted the lives of 140 children and youths in the rural parts of North Karnataka. Through this collaborative effort with the Sundar Bharath Foundation, NBI continues to be a beacon of hope, illuminating the path to a brighter future for the underserved communities in the region.

DRIVING APPROACH, GOVERNMENT & ADVOCACY

1

Governance & Administration:

NBI believes in a strong governance structure to ensure that the homes are managed as best as possible for the benefit of the children and staff. To this end, NBI has a Governing Board, and a Chief Functionary, besides Child Protection Committees, Caring Teacher circles, a Bal Sabha and Children's Committees in each home. The remedial education program is reviewed monthly by the CF along with the teachers, as is the home management with the home teams. The Governing Board (GB) meets once a quarter to review the work of the residential homes and suggest measures to address problems. GB members are all persons with rich experience in human resources in the corporate sector, child rights activists, or development workers with many years of experience. NBI undertakes regular monitoring of its work internally through its monthly, quarterly, and annual review meetings to ensure that governance structures are not only in place but functioning well.

2

Community Participation:

We visit the slum localities and build rapport with the local leaders, social workers, NGOs, and parents by sharing our organizational objectives and seeking their involvement in identifying needy children. We organize meetings at the community level and arrange exposure to our organizations and other organizations, doing the best work in the community. Connect the community people with other Govt. departments to avail the welfare schemes planned for the slum community.

3

Network with Stake Holders:

The organization works with children-related issues and is connected with the Child Welfare Committee, Department of Women and Children, Sarva Shikshana Abhiyan, Police Dept & Labor Dept. These departments are known about the organization's functioning and helping needy children. Organizations and volunteers like: RTO, Traffic Police, Utopia, Gift Apled, Youth for Seva, I Volunteer, Lions Club, Harmony Trust, Bhoomi Org, Being Social, Christ University, and other individuals are part of our network.

4

Policies:

Need Base India has formed a few policies to run the functioning of the organization and guidelines for the staff. The policies like Child Protection, Finance, Purchase, and Human Resources. Child Protection Policy, we discussed with the team in the meeting the purpose of forming the Child Protection Policy for all the staff to ensure that children staying in our shelter premises should not be abused or harassed. Even the staff or child can complain to this committee about any such incidents witnessed in the organization. Thus the Child Protection Policy oriented the staff to be sensitive with the children. The staff got sensitized on how to deal with the children and handling the issue of children is very sensitive. The other policies like Finance, Purchase, and Human resources are helping the program officers and admin staff in deciding according to the rules laid in these policies to set standards during the implementing process.

5

Transparency:

The organization ensures that information about its operations, including its governance, finances, programs, and activities are widely available to the public. Above all information is shared in our Annual Reports and is circulated to all our donors and other stakeholders. Every staff working from grass root level to the top has access to the account information. The budget copies of the funding agencies are also shared in the monthly meeting.

6

Monitoring of Programs & Accounts

NBI management has implemented a monitoring system, conducting monthly visits to our residential homes and other programs. The accounts section reviews financial records, updates registers, and holds meetings with staff. Additionally, program reviews are conducted monthly to verify that all planned activities are being carried out effectively and safety measures are being adhered to. As a result, the program is currently operating smoothly.

Statutory Compliance:

There are many Statutory Compliances that organizations need to adhere to. Among them, we have prepared our Audit Report for the year 2022-23. We have certificates of 12A and 80G from the Income Tax Department. We have renewed our organization for the year 2022-23 in the Registrar of the Society.


